What will it involve?

Step 1. Introductory visit to your company.

Discussion with your matched teacher on key areas of the curriculum, how a placement can benefit them and the key messages and skills you want students to be aware of for your industry.

Step 2. Optional introductory visit to the school.

Visit the college to assist or observe a lesson to learn more about how the subject is taught.

Step 3. You will then work with Inspire! to put together a **schedule** for their work experience.

Step 4. Tutors and businesses, with support from Inspire!, will **carry out their work experience placement** and work on curriculum enrichment ideas.

Step 5. Tutors will share the learning on a termly basis with fellow tutors.

Step 6. All participants will be invited to attend a **celebration event in summer 2018** to share good practice and the learning from their projects.

'Life lessons' and independent study for A Level students

A psychology teacher and law firm volunteer designed a project to teach a group of sixth form students to manage their own deadlines, bridging the gap between school and university.

The pair designed the programme in the subject working group meeting, keeping in regular contact to monitor the progress of the students.

Students were given an assignment to complete and told that their volunteer was available to support them via email and two face to face meetings. They arranged the sessions, found the offices and emailed the volunteer themselves.
